Application Procedure and required documents

- UC International Transfer Online Application <u>https://admissions.catalyst.uc.edu/apply/</u> Select "2022 Application" on the drop down menu. Do not select "College Credit Plus" and also do not apply using the Common Application if you have attended university or college after graduating from high school. Once you have submitted the UC Online Transfer Application, you will receive an email detailing all the documentation required to complete your application. Please submit all documentation prior to the transfer admission deadlines for your desired start term at the link here: <u>https://admissions.uc.edu/information/international/requirements/transfer.html</u>
 Students must meet English language proficiency by receiving admissible scores on a test such as Duolingo English Test (<u>https://englishtest.duolingo.com/home</u>), TOEFL (<u>www.ets.org</u>) or IELTS (<u>www.ielts.org</u>) as set forth by the specific program listed on the UC International admissions website: <u>https://admissions.uc.edu/information/international/requirements/transfer.html</u>.
 Students must meet academic qualifications to enroll in the specific program of study at the University of Cincinnati by submitting official transcripts with a cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale. Minimum GPA requirements and course prerequisites for specific programs are found here:

Admissions Documents

- A complete online transfer application at website below. Application fees of \$100 must be paid on-line when the application is submitted at https://admissions.uc.edu/apply.html
- Official transcript in English showing courses taken as well as courses in progress in the last semester.
- Official transcripts in a sealed envelope displaying cumulative GPA on a 4.0 scale.
- Following the end of the last semester of the last year, an updated transcript with grades is required. Students are required to submit a final transcript no later than 1 month before the start of their UC classes.
- Proof of English Proficiency with either DuoLingo English Test, IELTS, TOEFL, ACT, SAT or PTE (see academic admissions requirements above)

UC International Scholarship Criteria

- Students do not have to complete a separate scholarship application to be offered scholarships. The application for admission is the application for scholarships.
- Students will be notified when they receive the admissions offer letter the amount of scholarship they will be awarded.

Confirming Student Admission to UC

Visa Application Procedure and required documents

I-20 Issuance—The University of Cincinnati is certified by the U.S. government to host international students through the Student and Exchange Visitor Information SEVIS (SEVIS) program. Upon admission students will have to complete a series of steps, including documenting their financial ability to support their program of study, in conjunction with our International Services office. Students will receive direct communication from this office on these steps once admitted.
